Jud became the President and CEO of Partnership for Prevention in January 2011. Jud previously served as Partnership's President from 1995 to 1998. As President, he initiated activities to prioritize clinical preventive services, promote Medicare coverage of clinical preventive services, organize a Congressional Prevention Caucus, and assess which congressional actions would have the greatest impact on promoting health and preventing disease.

Jud served as Executive Director of the American College of Preventive Medicine for seven years. ACPM is the national professional society for physicians committed to disease prevention and health promotion and provides leadership in the science, policy, and practice of preventive medicine. Jud also served as Deputy Director and Acting Executive Director of the Public Health Foundation, and previously worked at the U.S. General Accounting Office, where he authored numerous reports to the Congress recommending policy and management improvements in a variety of federal programs.

Jud received his B.A. in Economics from the University of California at Berkeley, his Master of Public Affairs degree from the Lyndon B. Johnson School of Public Affairs at the University of Texas, and his Master of Public Health degree from the School of Public Health and Health Services at George Washington University.
